


What Is Financial Aid?

Financial aid consists of funds provided to students and families to help pay for postsecondary educational expenses





Free Application Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)





FAFSA is free to complete

Apply by March 1st

FAFSA opens December 1st (Usually October 1st)

Schools have deadlines

Apply each year

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®)

- Collects demographic and financial information
- Information used to calculate the student aid index (SAI)
- Colleges use SAI to offer financial aid
- Available in English and Spanish
- May be filed at any time during an academic year, but typically no earlier than October 1st prior to the academic year for which the student requests aid
- For the 2025-26 academic year, the FAFSA may be filed starting on or before December 1, 2024 (exact date to be determined)
- Colleges may set FAFSA priority dates

FAFSA Eligibility Criteria

You must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non citizen.

- You must have a high school diploma, GED or completed a homeschool program approved under state law.
- You must be enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program at the college you plan to attend.

CONSENT TO USE IRS DATA

You and all your FAFSA contributors must consent to have their information linked to the IRS. Failure to provide consent will cause your FAFSA to be rejected. 6

REVIEW AND SUBMIT YOUR FAFSA

Indicate which schools you would like your FAFSA to be sent to. Double-check that all the information is accurate. You will be notified when your contributors have completed their sections of the form.



- Used for FAFSA completion and access to certain U.S. Department of Education websites
- Student and parent must create own FSA ID
- May be used throughout financial aid process, including subsequent school years
- Only the owner should create an FSA ID



Federal Student Aid

Student Dependency Status: Dependent Student

Based on the answers provided by the student, they are considered a dependent student. The student is asked if they want a financial aid administrator to determine their eligibility for a Direct Unsubsidized Loan only. This is an option if the student's parents are unwilling to provide information. Typically, the student selects "No."




Dependent Student: Tell Us About Your Parents

As the student is considered dependent, they are asked to provide information about their parents. The FAFSA® form considers their "Parent" to be their legal (biological or adoptive) parent. The student is asked if their parents are married. The student selects "Yes" and is required to invite their parents to their FAFSA form to complete the required parent sections.




2025-2026 Dependent Student Special Circumstances

- Different than unusual circumstances (dependency overrides)
- Unique conditions exist that cannot be documented with the FAFSA, or circumstances have changed since filing
- Student should contact institution's financial aid office for more information
- Decisions are final and cannot be appealed to U.S. Department of Education



2025-2026 FAFSA Quick Tips

- 1. Students and contributors should create separate Federal Student Aid (FSA) accounts, with an ID and Password at www.studentaid.gov, before filling out the FAFSA.
- 2. Take a screenshot of the contributor's "Personal Information" page when they create their StudentAid.gov account (FSA ID). Students will need to enter this same information when inviting the contributor to their FAFSA form. (Name, SSN, DOB, Email)
- 3. The student should submit their section of the FAFSA first. *
- 4. All participants must provide consent to use the IRS DDX.
- 5. Have all documents ready to go: 2023 tax returns, account balances, etc. FSA has a helpful website: https://studentaid.gov/articles/things-you-need-for-fafsa/.
- Need help? Also, use the help functions within the FAFSA (including live chat) or call 1-800-4-FED-AID.
- 7. You can make corrections and update schools online.



The MHEC One Application is a "new" application that allows students to apply for all of the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) state financial aid and loan assistance repayment programs at one time

Additionally, this application replaces the Maryland State Financial Aid Application (MSFAA) and includes a section for "undocumented" students that are not eligible to complete the Free Application for Federal Aid (FAFSA), but may be eligible for Maryland state aid.

mportant Tips:

- The MHEC One App is NOT an application for federal financial aid. Students eligible to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must submit the FAFSA in order to be considered for federal and state (for certain programs) financial aid by going to https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa.
 - The 2023-2024 Maryland deadline to submit the FAFSA was March 1, 2023.
 - The 2024-2025 Maryland deadline to submit the FAFSA is June 1, 2024.
- If you are ineligible to submit the FAFSA, but would like to be considered for Maryland state aid, you must submit this application in order to be considered for state financial aid. Please be sure to check the first box on the program selection screen of this application.

Maryland's MHEC One App

The MHEC One App is available to applicants who are ineligible to receive federal aid and allows qualified children of undocumented immigrants who qualify for in-state tuition (Maryland Dream Act), to receive Maryland grants and scholarships.

The MHEC One App, available through the MDCAPS portal, opens every year at the same time the FAFSA opens.

Apply yearly to be considered for all available scholarships. Apply early and be aware of the various scholarship or grant program deadlines.

FAQs for the One App are available on MHEC's website.

Maryland Dream Act – allows undocumented immigrants to receive in-state tuition at AACC. The qualification for this special rate is available on AACC website.



State of Maryland (Promise Scholarship)

The Community College Promise
Scholarship is a <u>last dollar</u> scholarship
that is available to students who enroll
at a Maryland community college.

For priority consideration:

- Complete the FAFSA prior to high school graduation.
- Turn in a high school transcript after 1st semester of senior year, and again after graduation.
- Register for full-time coursework for the Fall semester.
- There is limited funding, so being eligible does not guarantee you will receive the Scholarship

Enroll in a full-time or part-time credit-bearing degree program.

Eligible for in-state tuition and enrolled at your local community college.

Meet GPA requirements and maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA after enrollment.

Annual income of \$100,000 if single-parent household, \$150,000 if two-parent household.

Eligible students can receive up to \$5,000 to cover any remaining tuition and mandatory fees per academic year.

Institutional Aid

- Visit your school's website or contact your college's financial aid office for information regarding scholarship opportunities...
 NOW.
- Apply early and be aware of deadlines, many are fast approaching.
- Some scholarships are awarded in the school application process.
- The AACC Foundation has over 200 scholarships and awards nearly \$1,000,000 annually. Application opens March 1st, and awards throughout the year.
- Scholarships for Continuing Education programs are available.



- Start looking and applying for outside scholarships as soon as October... (the earlier you apply, the less the competition) and watch the deadlines.
- Use as many resources as you can find:
 - High School Counselors (NAVIANCE)
 - Free scholarship searches are available at studentaid.gov/scholarships
 - U.S. Department of Labor's <u>FREE scholarship search tool</u>. (CareerOneStop)
 - Review for legitimate scholarship search sites
 - NEVER PAY FOR SCHOLARSHIP SERVICES
- Take time to create 2-3 really good essays (once done most essay questions are basically the same and you can copy & paste).
- Reach out to community groups and organizations you are affiliated with, as well as employers and local businesses

How Much Does College Cost?

Tuition and Fees - Cost of courses and required fees only.

COA - Cost Of Attendance is made up of tuition, fees, room and board, books, supplies, transportation, etc.

SAI (formerly EFC) - The Student Aid Index (Expected Family Contribution) determines your funding eligibility (based on the information reported on the FAFSA application.

Financial Need is the difference between the Cost of Attendance and your Expected Family Contribution. (COA - SAI (EFC) = Financial Need)

Types of Student Financial Aid

Gift Aid: Grants do not need to be paid back.

- Federal and State Grants
- State, Institutional, and Outside Scholarships

Self Help Aid: Loans need to be paid back.

- Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans: \$5,500 \$10,500 (depending on eligibility and dependency status)
- Federal Work-Study: Student work on campus. Depends on school availability

Other Sources:

VA, tuition assistance, Americorp, etc

Parent Resources:

Direct PLUS Loan for Parents: COA minus other aid received (more common at 4-year institutions)

Satisfactory Academic Progress

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) is a Federal Policy that requires a student to meet academic benchmarks to continue to receive Financial Aid

Federal regulations require AACC to review students for Satisfactory Academic Progress at the end of every semester. State Aid and Institutional Aid frequently will require an ok SAP status as well.

It is all about the numbers, this is what they are looking for:

- GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Completion rate of 70% or higher (# credits completed/# credits attempted)
- Finish Program within 150% of the credits required (if the degree needs 60 credits, you must complete the program without taking more than 90 credits)

Being SAP suspended does not mean you cannot get Financial Aid, just that you must complete a SAP appeal form to get it reinstated. The initial suspension is a computer just looking at the numbers, and the appeal is getting a human being to look at your individual situation.
